- 2. Stanza #1 10 syllables per line. Rhyme scheme: a-b-a-b. 4<sup>th</sup> syllable of each line rhymes with the end rhyme of the previous line.
- 3. Stanza #2 Syllable count: 8-8-8-6. Rhyme scheme: c-d-e-f Still has 4<sup>th</sup> syllable cross rhyme.
- 4. Stanza #3 Syllable count: 8-8-8-6. Rhyme scheme: g-f-d-f. 4<sup>th</sup> syllable cross rhyme.
- 5. Stanza #4 10 syllables per line. Rhyme scheme: h-i-h-i . 4<sup>th</sup> syllable cross rhyme.
- 6. Stanza #5 10 syllable lines. Rhyme Scheme: a-b-a-b. 4th syllable cross rhyme.
