Syllable Count: 12-10-8-8-10-12-6 repeat. The last line of each stanza is a six-syllable phrase you get from the first line. Put a semicolon between each set and an exclamation point at the end of statement. Or repeat the same six-syllable phrase at the end of each stanza. Minimum of 3 stanzas.

Rhyme Scheme: a-a-a-b-b-b-x. X means the last line will most likely not rhyme. Spiritual or about nature.
