Poetic Contemplation

To write poetry follow form. Lead straight letters down a straight line or see all the constraints are freed. dance different fonts, release words.

Musical sounds–nuzzle them close. To write poetry follow form to make rhymes resonate, resound or count out syllabic rhythms.

Intention guides the trajectory. Lines leap loopy loops down the page. To write poetry follow form. Suit individual poem.

The more approaches you know makes choice for each poem easier. Lead ideas, play around–but to write poetry follow form. Quatern: 4 quatrains for 16 lines total. Syllable Count: 8 per line. Similar to Kyrielle and the Retourne, A refrain is in a different line in each stanza.

First line is the second line in stanza 2 First line is the third line in stanza 3 First line is the fourth line in stanza 4.

It does not have to be iambic or follow a set rhyme scheme. These examples are unrhymed.
