- 1. Invented variation of 17th century French chain verse.
- 2. Written with a minimum of two stanzas with the number of lines at poet's discretion.
- 3. Unmetered.
- 4. Rhyme Scheme: x-a-x-a x-b-x-b etc. X=unrhymed. In couplets x-x a-a x-x-x-x-b-b c-c x-x-x-x x-x- d-d
- 5. Chained by the last word of each stanza being the first word in the next stanza.
