- 2. Four 3-line stanzas or tercets. One rhyming couplet.
- 3. 8 syllables per line. Variation uses ten syllables or iambic pentameter.
- 4. Two rhyme schemes: a-b-c a-b-c a-b-c a-b-c d-d or a-b-c c-b-a a-b-c c-b-a d-d
