Triquain:

- 1. Seven line stanzas. Heptastich.
- 2. Syllable Count: 3-5-9-12-9-6-3
- 3. Rhymed at discretion of the poet.
- 4. Can be written as a **chain** of two to four Triquains. The last word of the stanza is the first word in the next stanza. It is optional.
- 5. Can be written as a **crown**. Five stand alone linked stanzas. Last line of each stanza is repeated as the first line of the next stanza.
- 6. Can be written as a **swirl** joining the stanzas and eliminating the beginning 3 syllable line of each subsequent stanza. 3-6-9-12-9-6-3-6-9-2-9-6-3
